Phoneme Deletion of Initial Sound

Consider using the following activities at home with your child:

- ★ Can you delete (or take away) the first sound from a word? Try it with your own name! Say your name aloud. Now say your name without the first sound. Some examples are below:
 - Say Luke; without /l/, what's left is -uke
 - Say jam. Without /j/, what's left is? -am
 - Say gate. Without /g/, what's left is? -ate
- ★ When you say a word, you can also delete (or take away) the first sound.
 - Say, " gate; without /g/, what's left is?" and your child would say: "ate".
 - Other words to use:
 - Keep, without $/k/ \rightarrow -eep$
 - Jet, without $/j/ \rightarrow -et$
 - Pave, without $/p/\rightarrow$ -ave
- ★ Give your child a word with a beginning blend and have them repeat it back to you. Then, take away the first sound of the blend and see if they can tell you the new word.
 - Say blink → without /b/ what's left is? → link
 - Say crane \rightarrow without /c/ what's left is? \rightarrow rain
 - \circ Say space \rightarrow without /s/ what's left is? \rightarrow pace
