Phonemic Skills	At Home Activities
<b>Substitution of a Medial Vowel Phoneme</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>★ Can you change the medial (middle) vowel sound in words?<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>○ <b>Caregiver:</b> Say, dad. Now say dad, but instead of /a/ say /i/ <b>Student:</b> did</li><li>○ <b>Caregiver:</b> Say, listen. Now say listen, but instead of /i/ say /e/ <b>Student:</b> lesson</li></ul></li></ul>
<b>Phoneme Deletion of the Second Sound in a Blend</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>★ Can you tell me what is left if I delete (take away) the second sound in these words?<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>○ <b>Caregiver:</b> Say, plan. Now say plan, but don't say /l/ <b>Student:</b> pan</li><li>○ <b>Caregiver:</b> Say, brake. Now say brake, but don't say /r/ <b>Student:</b> bake</li></ul></li></ul>
<b>Phoneme Substitution of the Second Sound in a Blend</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>★ Can you change the second sound in words?<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>○ <b>Caregiver:</b> Say, spy. Now say spy, but instead of /p/ say /k/ <b>Student:</b> sky</li><li>○ <b>Caregiver:</b> Say, spill. Now say spill, but instead of /p/ say /t/ <b>Student:</b> still</li></ul></li></ul>
<b>Phoneme Substitution of the Final Consonant Sound</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>★ Can you change the final (last) sound in words?<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>○ <b>Caregiver:</b> Say, seed. Now say seed, but instead of /d/ say /t/ <b>Student:</b> seat</li><li>○ <b>Caregiver:</b> Say, hide. Now say hide, but instead of /d/ say /v/ <b>Student:</b> hive</li></ul></li></ul>
<b>Phoneme Substitution of the Final Sound in a Final Blend</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>★ Can you change the final (last) sound in words?<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>○ <b>Caregiver:</b> Say, warm. Now say warm, but instead of /m/ say /n/ <b>Student:</b> warn</li><li>○ <b>Caregiver:</b> Say, bird. Now say bird, but instead of /d/ say /th/ <b>Student:</b> birth</li></ul></li></ul>

<b>Phoneme Deletion of the Second to Last Sound in a Final Blend</b>	<p>★ Can you delete (take away) the second to last sound in words?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ <b>Caregiver:</b> Say, coast. Now say coast, but don't say /s/</li> <li><b>Student:</b> coat</li> <li>○ <b>Caregiver:</b> Say, desk. Now say desk, but don't say /s/</li> <li><b>Student:</b> deck</li> </ul>
<b>Phoneme Substitution of the Second to Last Sound in a Final Blend</b>	<p>★ Can you change the second to last sound in words?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ <b>Caregiver:</b> Say, lift. Now say lift, but instead of /f/ say /s/</li> <li><b>Student:</b> list</li> <li>○ <b>Caregiver:</b> Say, paint. Now say paint, but but instead of /n/ say /s/</li> <li><b>Student:</b> paste</li> </ul>
<b>Reversal of Sounds in a Single Syllable Word</b>	<p>★ Can you reverse (switch) the sounds in a word to make a new word?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ <b>Caregiver:</b> Say, keep. Now say keep backwards</li> <li><b>Student:</b> peek</li> <li>○ <b>Caregiver:</b> Say, tap. Now say tap backwards</li> <li><b>Student:</b> pat</li> </ul>
<b>Reversal of Sounds in a Two Syllable Word</b>	<p>★ Can you reverse (switch) the sounds in a word to make a new word?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ <b>Caregiver:</b> Say, midnight. Now say midnight backwards</li> <li><b>Student:</b> tine dim</li> <li>○ <b>Caregiver:</b> Say, tin gam. Now say tin gam backwards</li> <li><b>Student:</b> magnet</li> </ul>
